

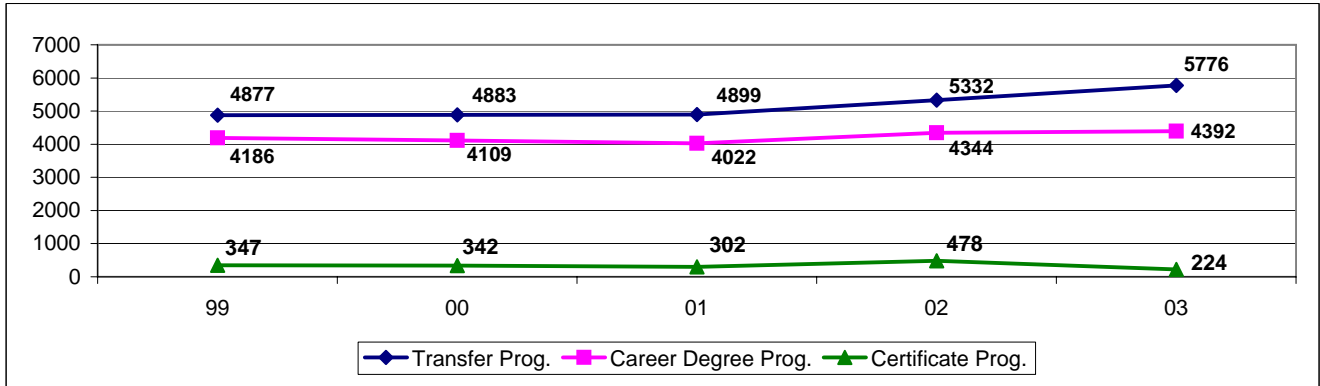

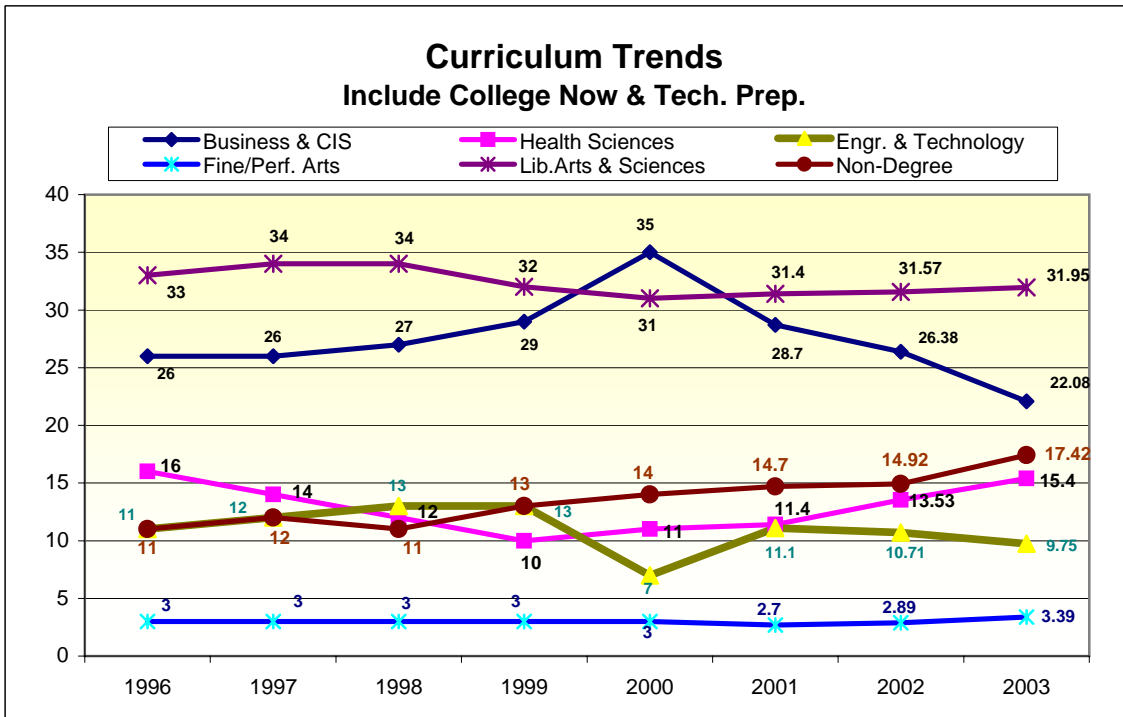
Enrollment in transfer programs has grown 18.4%; QCC is working on articulation agreements to maximize the success of student transfer.

Enrollment in Dual/Joint Liberal Arts has declined, which the chairperson attributes to the more demanding requirements of the curriculum; this is being addressed by assisting the students in bottleneck courses.

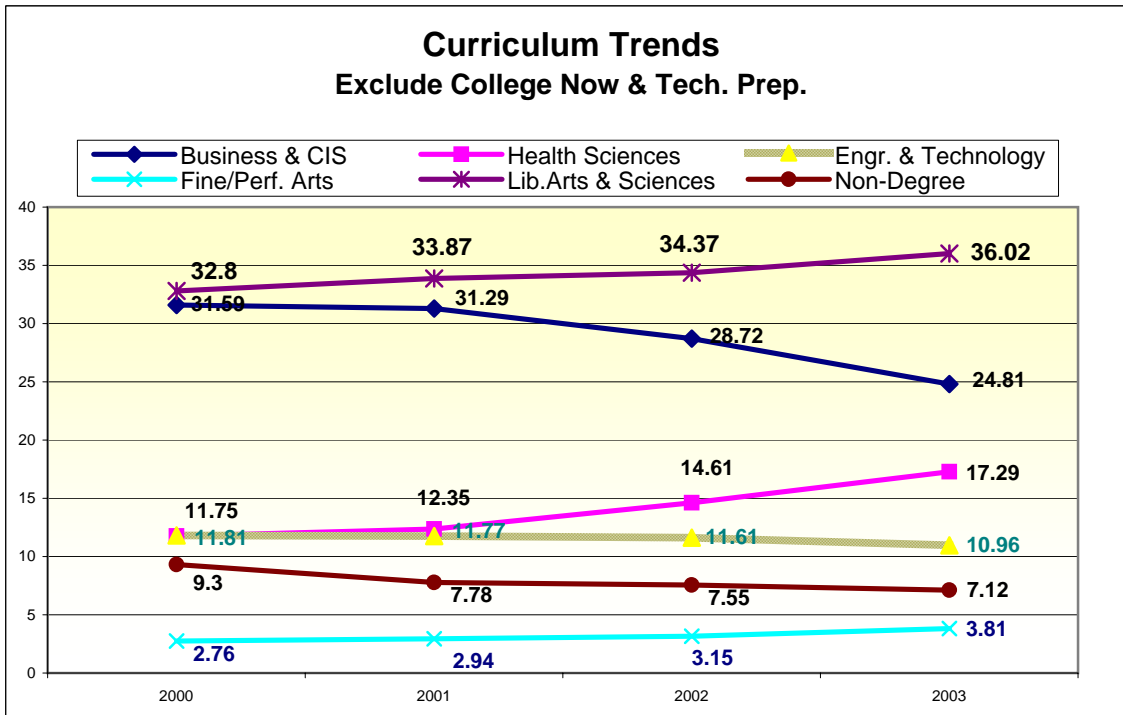
The declines in BA2 and BM2 are related to the rise in BT1 as students are more interested in a transfer curriculum. DP2 has declined as other curricula include computer training, therefore the Business Department is redesigning this program to match the current needs of industry

Programs in ET and CT are being revised to get a new student right into the "hands on" mechanical aspects of the courses which hopefully will appeal to students interested in these fields. Also better marketing of the different courses is being planned.

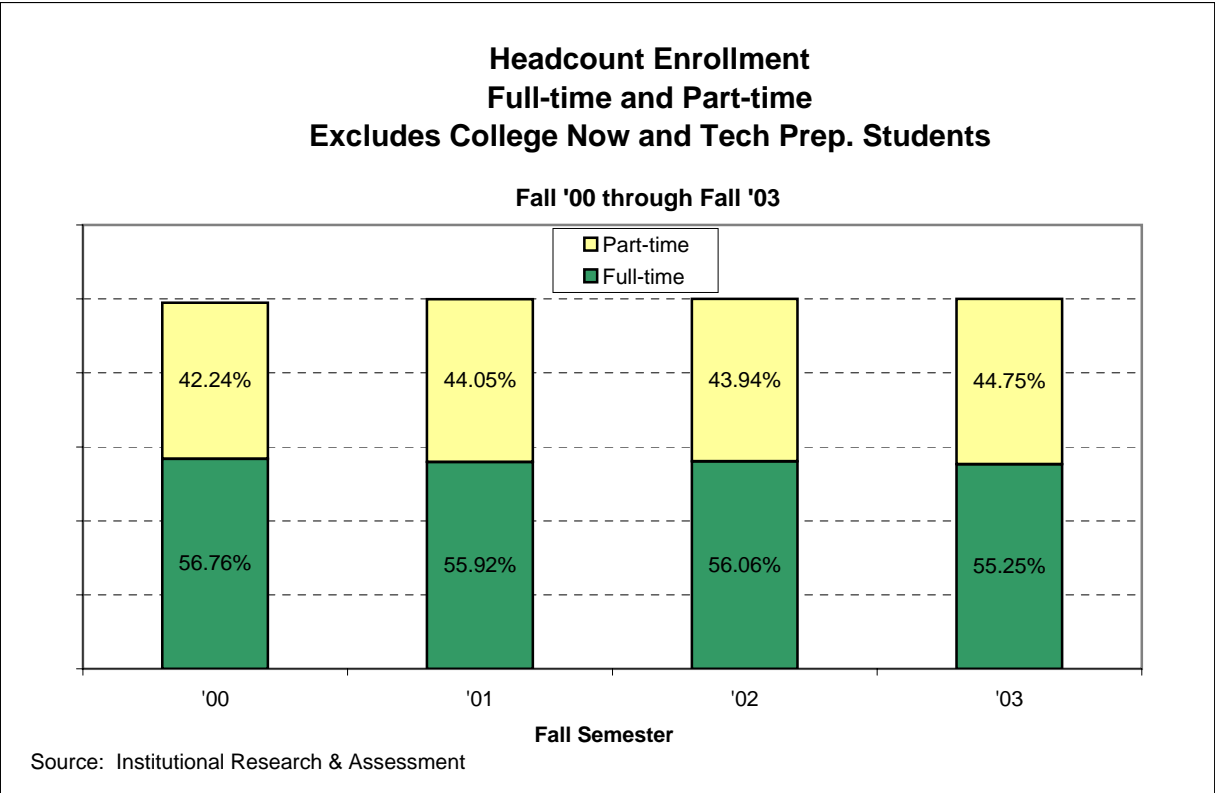
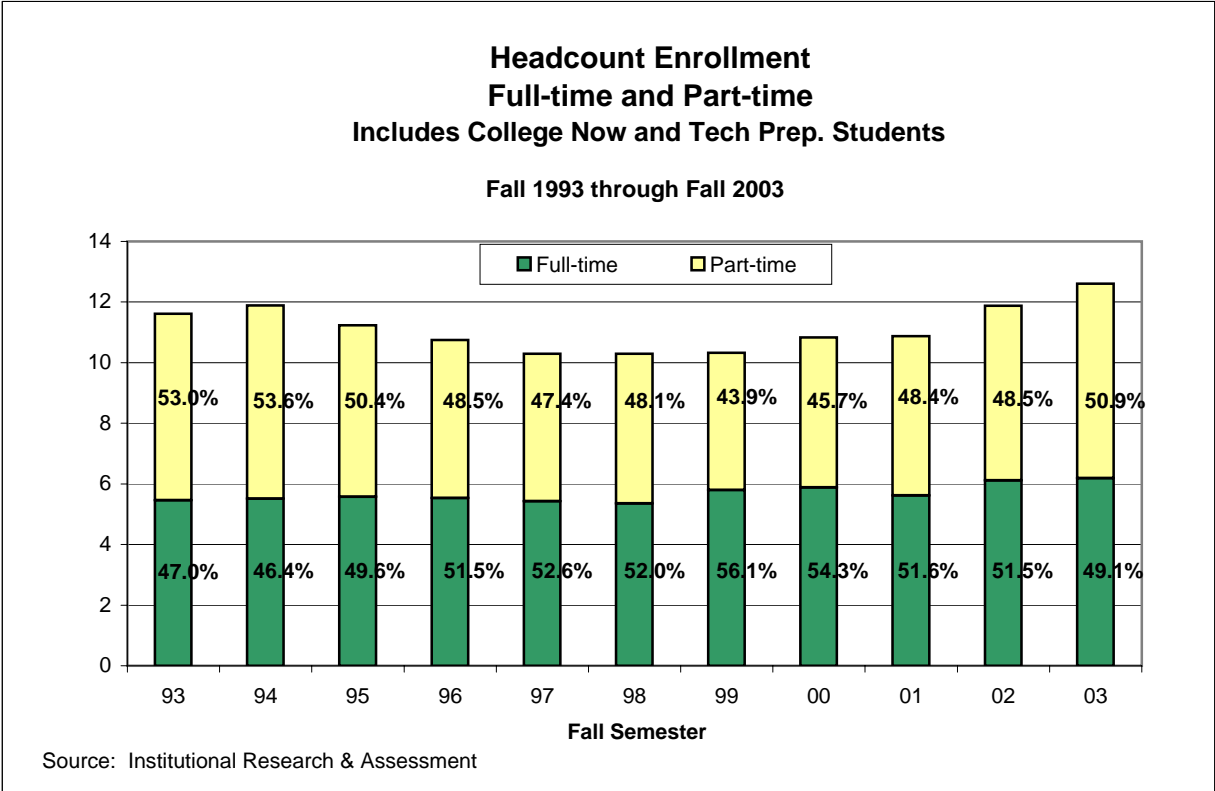
The Medical Laboratory Technology program was absorbed into the Health Sciences program. The Photography Certificate is being changed into a digital photography program which is expected to increase enrollment.



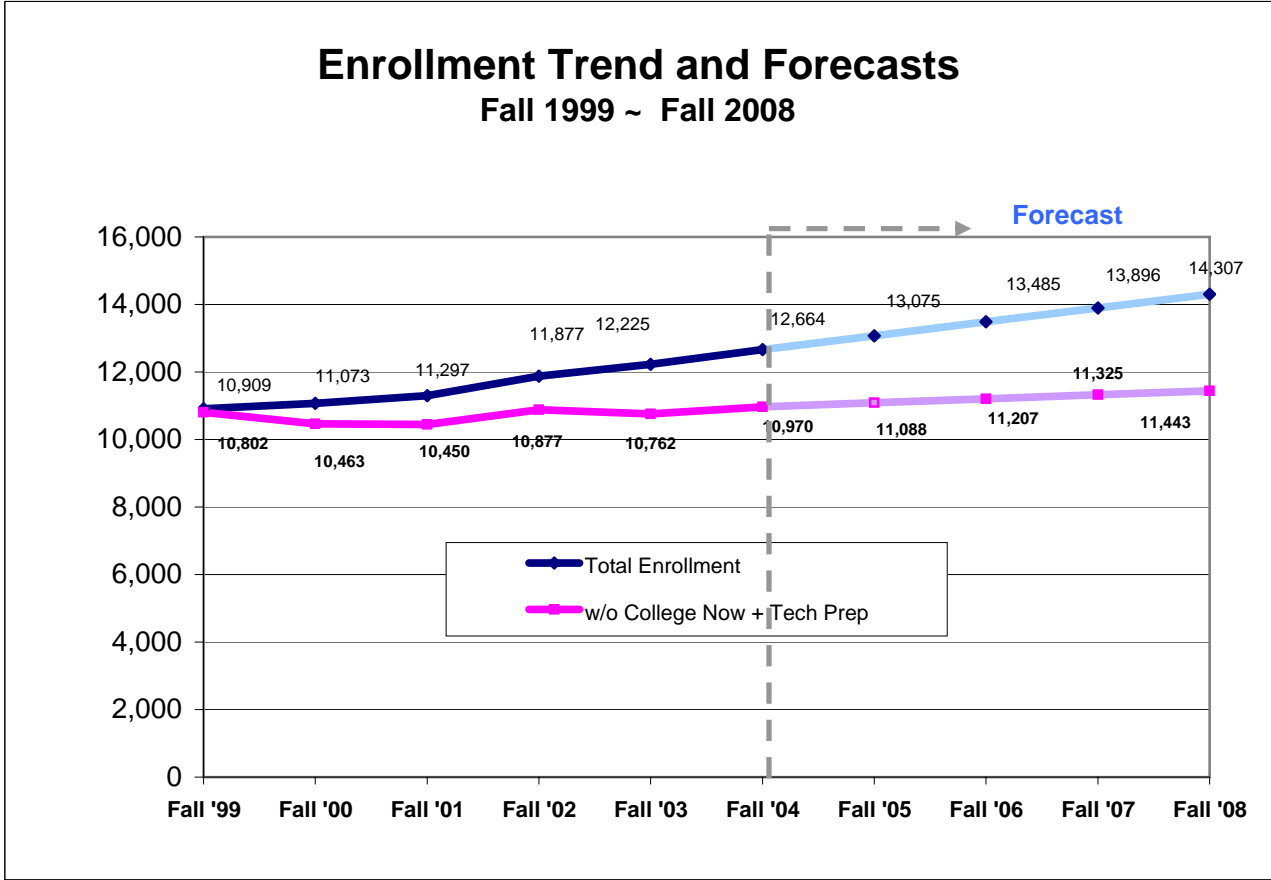

Liberal Arts and Sciences is growing as is Health Sciences. An announcement of a shortage in the Queens Health job market has spurred enrollment. Students view Liberal Arts as a path to transfer to a senior college. Business & CIS has declined because of a decline in the computer industry.

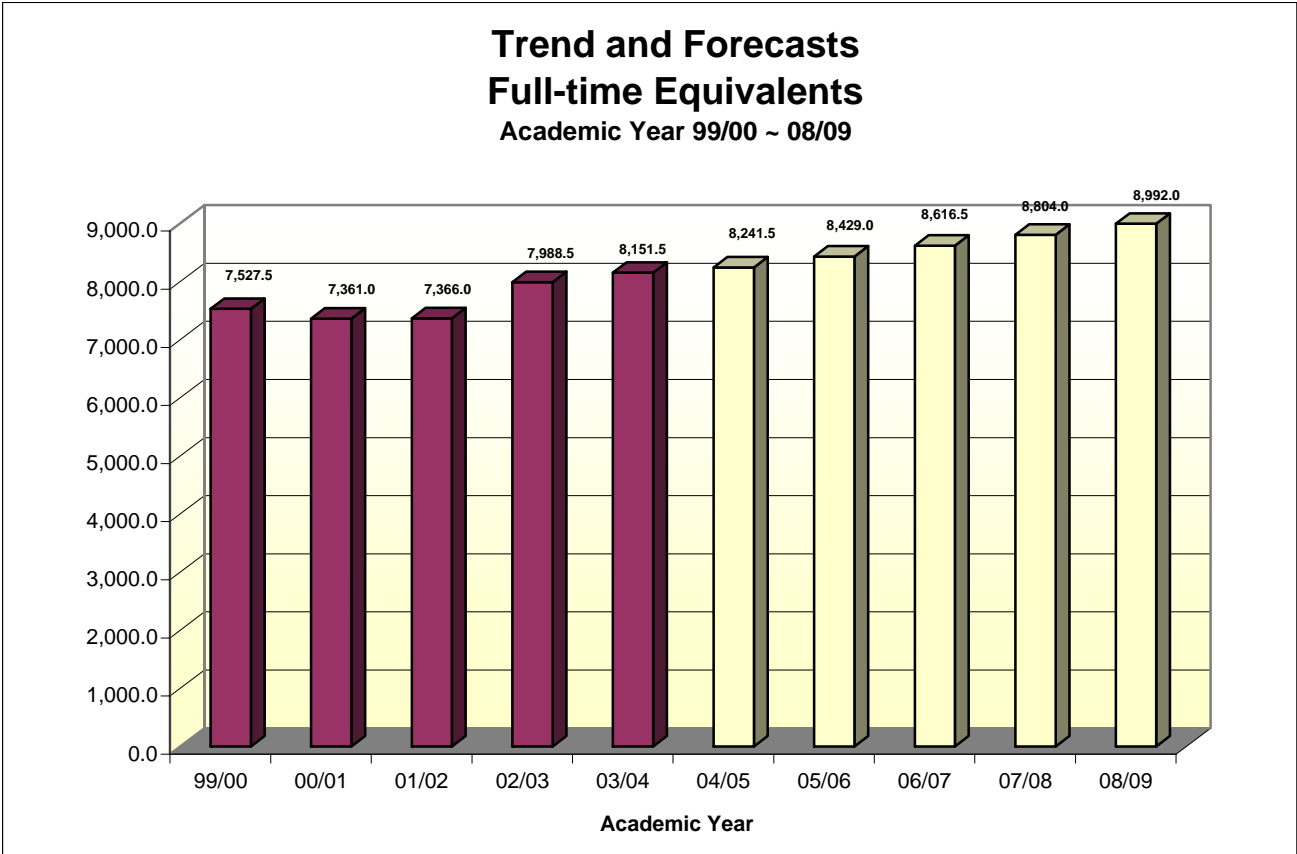


The top chart shows full and part-time enrollment for all students including the high school students who are part of College Now and Tech Prep and enrolled part-time at QCC. When these high school students are excluded, enrollment of full time matriculated students has remained constant since Fall '00.

Overall Fall enrollment has increased 12.1% between Fall '99 and Fall '03 (blue line). This figure includes high school students who participate in College-level courses through the CUNY College Now program and Tech Prep. When these high school students are subtracted from the figures (red line) enrollment is relatively constant from Fall '99 to Fall '03. The forecasts follow United States Census projections for Queens County and New York State Department of Education projections for high school graduations in Queens. This forecast was presented and discussed with department chairs in reviewing their program trends over the years.

Trend and forecasts were completed for the Full-time Equivalents (FTEs) for the academic years 99/00 through 08/09. The chart above indicates a slow and steady rise over the next five academic years. This follows the recent increases in FTEs since the 02/03 academic year.
