The number of credits you take each year will determine when you graduate. To graduate on time, you are strongly encouraged to enroll in at least 30 credits toward your degree during the calendar year, including fall and spring semesters and winter and summer sessions. This Degree Pathway is designed for students who place into **ENGL-101 and MA-119**. An additional pathway is available for students who must complete developmental math or English. - 2. Students who place above MA-119 will use MA-336 to satisfy Required Core 1B and take an additional 3 credits of free electives.
- 3. Students may count PSYC-101 toward Flexible Core 2E and take an additional 3 credits of free electives (an additional major elective course is recommended).
- 4. Students must complete one course from each of the Flexible Core categories (2A, 2B, 2C, 2D, and 2E) and one additional course from any one of the categories.
- 5. Major Electives: students must take two courses from the table below, at least one of which must be from the PSYC-200 series.
- 6. Students who take a STEM Variant course in 1C do not have to take an additional laboratory course

All students must complete two (2) WI designated classes to fulfill degree requirements.
