What Patient Care Technicians Do:

Patient Care Technicians are multi-disciplinary technical workers trained to provide basic nursing assistant care as well as other skilled functions. The disciplines included in the program at Queensborough Community College include seven core competencies in CPR, Standard First Aid, EKG, Phlebotomy, Medical Terminology, Cultural Competency, and Certified Nursing Assistant. After completing the program students can take the certification exam from the NHA and become a Certified Patient Care Technician (CPCT).

Where They Work:

Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Clinics, Labs and doctors' Offices all employ Patient Care Technicians.

Salary Information:

Salary can vary for this occupation depending on several factors including experience and qualifications, which can have different requirements depending on the employer.

The estimated NY salaries are below:

Orderlies:

Median Hourly Wage: \$15.60 in NYS Median Annual Wage: \$32,460 in NYS

The lowest 10% earn \$9.09/hr. & \$18,920/year

Nursing Assistants:

Median Hourly Wage: \$15.87 in NYS Median Annual Wage: \$33,010 in NYS

The lowest 10% earn \$10.57/hr. & \$21,980/year

Career Outlook:

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the employment of nursing assistants and orderlies is projected to grow 18 percent from 2012 to 2022, faster than the average for all occupations. Because of the growing elderly population, many nursing assistants and orderlies will be needed in long-term care facilities.
