III. 2015-16: Standing Committee and Academic Senate Vacancies

Whenever vacancies arise on the standing committees of the Academic Senate, the members of the Committee on Committees vote via email to appoint a new committee member. When a vacancy arises on the Academic Senate, the CoC Chair confers with the Senate Technology Officer to review the results of the previous Senate election and determine who will fill the vacancy. During the 2015-16 academic year, the Committee on Committees oversaw the assignment of new Senators, and voted to fill committee vacancies as noted below:

May 2015 (after the end of Dr. Cheryl Spencer's term and election of Dr. David Sarno)

A. Academic Development/Academic Development/Elective Academic Programs

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Leslie Francis, the CoC named Dr. Yusuf Gurtas (Mathematics & Computer Science) to this committee.

B. Committee on Computer Resources

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Kathleen Wentrack, the CoC named Prof. Marlon Moreno (Chemistry) to this committee.

C. Committee on Curriculum

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Moni Chauhan, the CoC named Prof. Richard Yuster (Engineering Technology) to this committee.

D. Committee on Environment, Quality of Life, and Disability Issues

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Jung Joon Lee, the CoC named Dr. Julia Rothenberg (Social Science) to this committee.

October 2015

A. Academic Senate

Dr. Jose Osorio (Foreign Languages and Literatures) was placed on the Academic Senate following the resignation of Aranzazu Borrachero.

B. Committee on Admissions

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Kimberly Banks, the CoC named Dr. Sharon Ellerton (Biological Sciences and Geology) to this committee. Dr. Ellerton was the Steering Committee Designee (SCD). The Steering Committee appointed a new SCD.

C. Committee on eLearning

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Jodie Childers, the CoC named Dr. Sharon Reeves (Foreign Languages and Literatures) to this committee. Dr. Reeves was the Steering Committee Designee. The Steering Committee appointed a new SCD.

D. Committee on WID/WAC

This committee had been understaffed since the roster was increased from six to nine members. Term lengths of one, two, and three-years were randomly assigned. The CoC named Dr. Lakersha Smith (Social Sciences, term end 2018), Dr. Areti Tsimounis (Biological Sciences and Geology, term end 2016), and Dr. James Nichols (History, term end 2017) to this committee. Dr. Smith was the Steering Committee Designee. The Steering Committee appointed a new SCD.

November 2015

A. Committee on Cultural and Archival Resources

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Sarah Danielsson, the CoC named Dr. Leslie Francis (Business) to this committee. Dr. Francis was the Steering Committee Designee. The Steering Committee appointed a new SCD.

December 2015

A. Committee on eLearning

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of William Blick, the CoC named Aviva Geismar (HPED) to this committee. Aviva was the Steering Committee Designee. The Steering Committee appointed a new SCD.

February 2016

A. Committee on Curriculum

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of David Klarberg, the CoC named Todd Holden (Physics) to this committee. (Todd had been serving on the Bylaws Committee. He stepped down and a new member was elected when committee placements were made in April.)

May 2016

A. Academic Senate

Dr. Andrew Nguyen (Biological Sciences and Geology) will be on sabbatical leave for the 2016-2017 academic year. Since this reduces the number of Senators from Biological Sciences and Geology to four, Julian Stark has been assigned to serve the rest of this term, which begins in fall 2016 and ends April 2017.

B. Committee on eLearning

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Barbara Saur, the CoC named Dr. Barbara Rome (Nursing) to this committee.

C. Committee on Course and Standing

To fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Dr. Andrew Nguyen, the CoC named Dr. Nina Sarkar (Business) to this committee.

D. Committee on Curriculum

To fill a vacancy left by the passing of Dr. Barbara Bonous-Smit, the CoC named Dr. Tina Bayer (Nursing) to this committee.

IV. Academic Senate Elections

Nomination petitions were revised and then sent to Faculty and CLTs for seats on the Academic Senate. The nomination period, originally scheduled from Feb. 2 to Feb. 16, was extended until Feb. 23. 21 Faculty responded for 14 positions and 2 CLTs responded for one position. The candidates were asked to provide personal statements, which Joel Kuszai posted on the website. Jeffrey Schwartz (Senate Technology Officer) prepared the online ballots, and the election ran from the morning of March 1 to 5 p.m. on March 15. Raj Vaswani (Information Technology) provided assistance with the online election system.

248 (66.31%) of the 374 eligible faculty voted for Faculty Members-at-Large. The candidates with the top twelve votes all won Senate seats, as did the candidates with the 14th and 17th most votes. The candidates with the 13th, 15th, and 16th highest number of votes could not be seated because they come from the Departments of Biological Sciences & Geology and Nursing, which are both at their maximum representation on the Senate. They will instead be “alternates” and will join the Senate if someone in their department steps down early. (This happened with the resignation of A. Nguyen of Biological Sciences & Geology who was replaced by J. Stark of the same department – see section III above.) 30 (68.18%) of the 44 eligible CLTs voted for CLT Member-at-Large. The complete results of the election were announced to the campus community and appear in **Appendix A**. The 2016-2017 Senate roster is in **Appendix B**.

V. Elections to the Standing Committees of the Academic Senate

Faculty and HEOs were invited to select the committees on which they would prefer to serve via an online system that was available from Feb. 10 through Feb. 24. CLTs were asked to indicate their preferences via email to the CoC Chair. The database was managed by Raj Vaswani and the list of eligible instructional staff was assembled by Debra DiBattista (Human Resources and Labor Relations). At least two reminder emails were sent out during the selection period. Several HEOs replied that they were not aware they were eligible to serve on Senate Committees, so a message was sent specifically clarifying the situation. 120 members of the instructional staff indicated their committee preferences (89 faculty, 29 HEOs, and 2 CLTs). There are a total of 129 committee seats, but there were only 47 open positions.

The CoC had two meetings and exchanged numerous emails to prepare a ballot, which was then distributed via email on March 28 to CLTs, faculty, and HEOs in accordance with the Bylaws (Article VII, section 4a). A self-nomination form with detailed instructions was prepared and included in this mailing. There were no self-nominations.

At the April 12 Academic Senate meeting, paper ballots were distributed to all voting members of the Senate. The members of the Standing Committees for 2016-2019 were unanimously elected as a single slate. (A limited number of candidates were elected for terms ending in 2017 or 2018 in order to fill vacancies left by those who chose to step down before their assigned terms ended.) A list of candidates who were not elected will be maintained by the CoC and will be consulted to fill vacancies as they arise during the year. The CoC has also made a few suggestions to the Steering

Committee regarding suitable Steering Committee Designees. The rosters for the Standing Committees are in **Appendix C**. After updating the CoC database, the corresponding committee webpages were updated by Dave Moretti.

VI. Other Notable Accomplishments during 2015-2016

- A.** The CoC assisted the Steering Committee and the Faculty Executive Committee by researching the number of faculty serving on the Senate and its Standing Committees in various capacities, compared to how many applied for service.
- B.** The CoC, at the request of the Steering Committee, worked with Committee Chairs to establish set meeting days and times for most of the Standing Committees.
- C.** The CoC worked with Raj Vaswani (CoC Database Manager, Information Technology) to improve the system for requesting committee selections and making assignments in the CoC database. By adding term ending dates to the database,
 - 1.** It is much easier to identify and communicate with members whose terms are either ending or ongoing
 - 2.** Members who want to step down early are easily removed from rosters and placed back on the list of faculty eligible for committee service.
 - 3.** Continuing members automatically populate the database in the new year, which not only reduces the amount of time needed to update the database, but also significantly reduces errors and omissions when making assignments. In addition, continuing members no longer have to reapply to remain on their committees.

VII. Ongoing Business

In addition to those items that were completed during the academic year, there are others that should be addressed:

- A.** The Senate has voted to revive the Committee on Ceremonial Occasions. Three members will have to be appointed. One member will have a three-year term, one will have a two-year term, and one will have a one-year term. Shannon Kincaid is interested, but has just been elected to the CoC. He has offered to serve as a Steering Committee Designee, if not as a full member. The Steering Committee should be consulted.
- B.** The CoC guidebook needs to be updated. The most recent version updated by Ed Volchok cannot be located on the committee websites or on Blackboard.
- C.** Article VII, section 4a of the Bylaws should be examined with the Bylaws Committee. Self-nomination after the CoC has already prepared the committee ballots should either be removed or revised. This was briefly discussed with Steve Hammel in May. Bylaws will consider it in the fall.
- D.** The “What Faculty Need To Know” webpage should be renamed and revised to include all instructional staff by referring to CLTs and HEOs in addition to Faculty.
- E.** CLTs should be included with eligible instructional staff (faculty and HEOs) who are invited via email to select their committee preferences.
- F.** The Departments of Academic Literacy and English will merge on July 1, 2016. Jeffrey Schwartz, the Senate Technology Officer, has addressed its effect on the Academic Senate: 1) The English

Department will have more than the maximum number (4) of allowed Members-At-Large. All senators from that combined department will be allowed to finish their terms but any senators who are running will be restricted by this limit, including those whose terms are expiring and would otherwise wish to run again. 2) The soon-to-be former chair of the Academic Literacy Department will no longer be a senator. At the present time there are no plans to fill this newly available seat. In addition, the CoC should be aware that any Standing Committees that currently have one member from both departments will now have two members from English. These committee members should be permitted to finish their terms. Rosters and other committee documents should be updated, for example, as “[Member name], English (formerly Academic Literacy), [term ends]”. The usual restrictions of one Department member per committee should be followed for the 2017 elections.

VII. A Final Note of Gratitude

I would like to express my gratitude to everyone on the Committee on Committees. It has been a pleasure serving on this committee for three years and being chairperson this last year. I am grateful to Dr. Dona Boccio who served as Secretary of the CoC for the past year. I would like to thank Professor Jeffrey Schwartz, the current Senate Technology Officer, for keeping me on an effective and manageable timeline and for overseeing the online Senate elections. I would like to thank Raj Vaswani for managing the CoC database and for working with me to implement a number of changes that improve the committee selection mechanism for both the instructional staff and the CoC. I would like to thank Dr. Peter Bales, Dr. Emily Tai, Dr. Joel Kuszai, Dr. Philip Pecorino, and Dr. Karen Steele for their constant support, encouragement, and advice throughout the year. Lastly, I want to thank Dr. Cheryl Spencer who has been a great support and mentor and who did everything she could to prepare me for being the Chair of this committee. I leave the CoC a more informed and committed member of Queensborough Community College.
