



Requirements/Eligibility

To be eligible for the Transfer Honors Program, you must be a full-time student enrolled in an AA, AS, or BA program with 60 hours completed at the end of the current semester and have at least a 3.5 GPA. You should be able to demonstrate that you have taken courses in composition, the humanities, the social sciences, mathematics, and the laboratory sciences. Students already enrolled at Queens College are not eligible to apply.

As a THP student, you must maintain at least a 3.3 GPA, complete at least 12 credit hours per semester, and participate in an approved honors experience.

Partner Honors Programs

The Transfer Honors Program primarily provides financial and academic support for our students. As a THP student, you are required to engage in an honors experience that suits your scholarly interests and career plans. Our partner honors programs provide options that will help you develop projects and make contacts in your field. - 1. Visit www.qc.cuny.edu/academics/honors/scholarships/ for instructions and a link to the application.
- 2. Complete the application: fill out the supplemental application form and submit it with your personal statement, writing sample, transcript, and a letter of recommendation.

Priority deadlines are May 1 (for Fall admission) and December 1 (for Spring admission). All applications that meet the priority deadline for the term will receive full consideration; after this deadline, applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis to fill remaining spots. Please look for additional announcements on our website. Students already enrolled at Queens College are not eligible to apply.
