The number of credits you take each year will determine when you graduate. To graduate on time, you are strongly encouraged to enroll in at least 30 credits toward your degree during the calendar year, including fall and spring semesters and winter and summer sessions. This Degree Pathway is designed for students who place into **developmental English and math**. An additional pathway is available for students who place into ENGL-101 and MA-119. Notes:

1. Prerequisites for a course must be passed before taking the course. Corequisites must be passed before taking the course or taken in the same term as the course.
2. Certain required courses also fulfill core requirements (1B, 1C, and 2E). If students do not take those courses to satisfy the specified areas of the common core, they will still have to complete those courses (as additional credits) to fulfill degree requirements.
3. Students must complete one course from each of the flexible core categories (2A., 2B, 2C, 2D, and 2E) and one additional course from any one of the categories. BI-520 is required for the degree and will fulfill the requirement for Flexible Core 2E.
4. SOCY-101 and a 200-level Sociology course are recommended for students planning to transfer to Hunter College's B.S. in Community Health Program.
5. Select at least 11 credits from: BI-461 General Microbiology, BI-501 Environmental Health, BI-505 Current Environmental Issues, BI-522* Applied Biostatistics, BI-554 Research Laboratory, HE-102 Health, Behavior and Society, HE-104 Addictions and Dependencies, HE-105 Human Sexuality, HE-107 Mental Health: Understanding your Behavior, HE-108 Health & Physical Fitness, HE-110 Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, HE-111 Stress Management, and HE-202* Social and Behavioral Determinants of Health; *Recommended for York's B.S. Public Health Program
6. PSYC-101 is recommended for students planning to transfer to York College's B.S. in Public Health Program.

All students must complete two (2) WI designated classes to fulfill degree requirements.
