A.A. in Liberal Arts and Sciences leading to the B.A. in Childhood Education at Queens College Catalog Year 2025-26

The Dual/Joint Associate Degree/Baccalaureate Degree program in Liberal Arts and Sciences and Childhood Education provides Queensborough students with the first two years of an articulated liberal arts transfer program leading to a baccalaureate degree in a liberal arts major and a co-major in Childhood Education at Queens College. In keeping with New York State's learning standards for teacher education, the program design allows a student to use the first two years to maximum benefit in preparing for the upper division teacher education programs and the liberal arts major of their choice.

The number of credits you take each year will determine when you graduate. To graduate on time, you are strongly encouraged to enroll in at least 30 credits toward your degree during the calendar year, including fall and spring semesters and winter and summer sessions. This degree map is designed for students who place into **ENGL-101** and **MA-119**. An additional map is available for students who must complete developmental math or English. Please see the degree website or your advisor for more information.

Notes:

1. Due to New York State requirements, a grade of B is required in in one course in each of the NYS Core Areas (English, Social Studies, Math, and Physical Sciences). No grade lower than a C is acceptable for the program.
2. Prerequisites for a course must be passed before taking the course. Corequisites must be passed before taking the course or taken in the same term as the course.
3. A grade of B or better is required in ENGL-101 or ENGL-102
4. Several courses designated in the Common Core as “Recommended” fulfill both general education and major requirements. If students do not take these courses in the Common Core, they will have to take additional credits to complete their degree requirements.
5. A grade of B or better is required in EDUC-101
6. The following Liberal Arts courses are required prerequisites in the program for transfer: PH-101, HIST-127, HIST-128, MA-303, MUS-210.
7. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 is required to graduate from the program

All students must complete two (2) WI designated classes to fulfill degree requirements.
