Notes:

1. Prerequisites for a course must be passed before taking the course. Corequisites must be passed before taking the course or taken in the same term as the course..
2. Students must complete one course from each of the Flexible Core categories (2A, 2B, 2C, 2D, and 2E) and one additional course from any one of the categories. SOCY-101 is strongly recommended for Flexible Core 2D.
3. If HIST-110, HIST-111, or HIST-112 is taken for Flexible Core 2A, take a second HIST-100 course instead. If two history courses have been taken, a 200-level SOCY course is recommended.
4. This course is not required for students who take a 4-credit STEM variant course in Required Core 1C.
5. Students who plan to pursue Sociology major are strongly recommended to take: SOCY-220 Urban Sociology, SOCY-230 Sociology of the Family, or SOCY-275 Media and Society AND SOCY-240 Racial and Ethnic Relations or SOCY-250 Sociology of Gender
6. Two sequential courses in the same language are required. Please visit the [Department of Modern Languages and Cultures](#) for placement into the first course.

Students must complete a minimum of 48 Liberal Arts and Sciences courses for this program. [Please see the catalog](#) for course subjects that fall into that category.

All students must complete two (2) WI designated classes to fulfill degree requirements.
