A.S. in Music – Catalog Year 2025-26

Starting in Fall 2024, the Department of Music has implemented admissions requirements for the A.S. in Music degree program. All applicants to the A.S in Music must take the Basic Musicianship Aptitude Test (BMAT) and the Music Theory Placement Exam (MTPE). The BMAT will be administered at the beginning of fall and spring semesters. See the <u>Music Department website</u> for scheduled dates. The MTPE portion will be administered either in conjunction with the BMAT or by appointment with the music department. <u>Contact the Music Department</u> to schedule the test.

Applicants who meet the minimum required threshold of 4 out of 10 on a combined score of the BMAT and MTPE will be accepted and matriculated in the A.S. in Music degree program.

Applicants who do not meet the minimum required threshold may still gain entry to the program by first completing a set of introductory courses with minimum specified grades.

Interested applicants will be enrolled in the Liberal Arts and Sciences A.A. degree with a Liberal Studies concentration. They should register for the following courses in their first semester:

- MUS-111 Musicianship I
- MUS-121 Music Theory I
- Music 160-180 Series Individual Study in Music Performance
- MUS-141/186 Convocation I
- Select one course from the following MUS 400-Level:
 - o Music Pop Choir
 - Music Queensborough Chorus
 - Music Queens Symphonic Band
 - o Music Jazz Ensemble
 - o Music Percussion Ensemble

Students who wish to be full time in their first term should also enroll in ENGL-101 and a pathways course.

Any applicant who successfully achieves a B or better in MUS-111 and a C or better in both MUS-121 and MUS-150-180 series have met the application requirements and will be enrolled in the A.S. in Music degree program.

Applicants who do not successfully complete the required courses with the minimum grade requirements will not be admitted to the A.S. in Music degree. They may remain enrolled in in the A.A. in Liberal Arts and Sciences degree or change their major to another degree program.

The number of credits you take each year will determine when you graduate. To graduate on time, you are strongly encouraged to enroll in at least 30 credits toward your degree during the calendar year, including fall and spring semesters and winter and summer sessions. This degree map is designed for who place into **developmental English** and **mathematics**. An additional map is available for students who place into college-level math and English. Please see the degree website or your advisor for more information.

Courses in **Bold Text** are prerequisites for later courses or only offered in the Fall or Spring semester and should be taken where indicated in the sequence.

Notes:

- 1. Prerequisites for a course must be passed before taking the course. Corequisites must be passed before taking the course or taken in the same term as the course.
- 2. All MUS-AS students must enroll in MUS-121 unless the student is exempt based on the Music Placement Test. Exempt students who do not receive a grade of C or higher in MUS-121 may be required to take MUS-111 or MUS-112 as an advised music elective. Students wishing to take the Music Placement Test may schedule a time by contacting the Music department, Humanities Building, Room 140; 718-631-6393.
- Students must complete one course from each of the Flexible Core categories (2A, 2B, 2C, 2D, and 2E) and one additional course from any one of the categories. MUS-102 (required) will fulfill Flexible Core 2C. SP-211 is recommended for Flexible Core 2B. Music history courses (MUS 103, MUS 104 or MUS 105) are recommended for the additional flexible core course.
- 4. Students may not select MUS-401, MUS-402, MUS-403, or MUS-404 to satisfy this requirement.
- 5. Students who demonstrate skills to pass out of any or all Class Instruction in Piano Courses must take additional music elective courses to reach 60 credits. Students may choose from the table below.
- 6. This course is not required for students who take a 4-credit STEM variant course in Required Core 1C.

All students must successfully complete two Writing Intensive classes (designated "WI") to fulfill degree requirements.
