HRTP: A Public Health Internship Program of the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH) is pleased to inform you that the application period for our spring 2017 internship program opens on October 15th and closes on November 15th, 2016. Please note, to submit an application, students will have to create a user ID/ log on NYC Med. For more information about the program, for instructions on how to apply or to complete an application, please visit our website. Applications and supplemental documents for the spring 2016 session are due on November 15th, 2016. Late applications will not be considered.

For full consideration, with a postmark on or before the deadline, HRTP will need:

- 1. An electronic application
- 2. A current resume
- 3. A personal statement/ essay
- 4. An official transcript from your current institution
- 5. One letter of recommendation and an academic recommendation form

Established in 1960 to recruit and train future generations of public health professionals, HRTP provides exceptional undergraduate, graduate, and professional students hands-on experiences in public health within the various divisions and programs of the NYC DOHMH. HRTP interns work on projects with experienced public health professionals, many of whom are recognized experts and leaders in their areas of public health.

HRTP is open to undergraduate, graduate and professional school students of public health, health education, laboratory sciences, medicine, social work, environmental engineering, public administration, accounting, mathematics, computer science, law, nursing and the social sciences. HRTP offers dynamic internships in public health research, community health outreach and education, fieldwork, laboratory work and public health administration.

In addition to internships, HRTP offers several unique benefits for its students, including advocacy, supplemental curricula, assistance with completion of academic and practicum requirements for various degree programs, work evaluation and file retention so that successful internships may be listed on résumés and used as a reference.

In some cases, financial support is available for HRTP students working on DOHMH projects. Some projects may provide a stipend. In other cases, eligible students may be able to apply their Federal College Work-Study award to the work done here at the agency – we ask that you verify this with your

University or contact us for additional information. Students who are unable to obtain funding may participate in the program as a volunteer.
