Employers have stressed that the NACE Career Competencies are skills that they want to see students develop while in college so that when they are hired, students are ready on day one to become valuable, contributing members of their companies and organizations.

Career & Self Development: Throughout my career, I am willing to learn and teach myself new skills to perform and do my job well and be aware of the skills and knowledge that are necessary to move forward in my career.

Proactively develop oneself and one's career through continual personal and professional learning, awareness of one's strengths and weaknesses, navigation of career opportunities, and networking to build relationships within and outside one's organization.



Communication: I am comfortable using all types of communication, e.g., face-to-face meetings, speech-making, writing emails, reports and memos, as well as career-specific writing styles.

Clearly and effectively exchange information, ideas, facts, and perspectives with persons inside and outside of an organization.



Critical Thinking: I can analyze problems and find solutions.

Identify and respond to needs based upon an understanding of situational context and logical analysis of relevant information.



Equity & Inclusion: I am interested and open to learning about other people's cultures and customs and inclusive when working with diverse groups of people. I practice and promote anti-racist behavior.

Demonstrate the awareness, attitude, knowledge, and skills required to equitably engage and include people from different local and global cultures. Engage in antiracist practices that actively challenge the systems, structures, and policies of racism.



Leadership: I can lead and motivate people to accomplish a task.

Recognize and capitalize on personal and team strengths to achieve organizational goals.

Career & Self Development

- Become a member of the QCC **Handshake** Community. Login into your account and customize your Handshake profile.
- During your first semester at QCC, engage in career exploration using Career Coach, FOCUS 2, and Pathful

Explore.

- Obtain an internship or apprenticeship. Meet with the Office of Career Services' Career and Experiential Learning Specialist to learn about the QCC internship process.
- Visit the Office of Career Services and learn how to produce an excellent résumé (use **SkillsFirst** to create your résumé), and cover letter, improve your interview skills and prepare to encounter different types of interviews.
- Attend Employer Information Sessions to learn about job and internship opportunities with local employers and conduct a successful job search as well as understand business etiquette.
- Check to see if you are eligible for ASAP (Accelerated Study in Associate) **Programs)**, or **College Discovery**, two programs that can help you build your career and self-development skills..
- Network effectively and use **Handshake** and **LinkedIn**.
- Sign-up to receive the CUNY Career Success Initiatives Career Opportunities Newsletter.
- Consider job shadowing with a professional in the field you are interested in joining.
- Register to become a **CUNY Upskiller** and take a course in: Business, IT & Software Development, Healthcare Administration, Data Analytics, Professional Skills, or Career Resources.



Communication

- Be an active participant in your classes.
- Apply to become a CUNY/311 Student Call Taker and gain invaluable telephone etiquette and communication skills.
- Enroll in specific coursework that will strengthen your communication skills (Writing Intensive classes, Speech classes). Participate in theatre/drama presentations.
- Join **Student Government** and become a more confident public speaker.
- Apply to fellowships and academic opportunities that require a writing sample or personal statement, e.g., America Needs You.
- Enter an essay contest the Dr. K. York & M. Noelle Chynn CUNY Ethics and Morality Essay Contest.
- Engage in appropriate social media activity and blogging within your professional interest.



Critical Thinking

- Engage in academic research: apply to become a member of CRSP (CUNY Research Scholars Program or the BRIDGES to the baccalaureate Program.
- Apply to become a member of **CSTEP** (**Collegiate** Science and Technology Entry Program).
- Apply to become a tutor with QCC CTAS (Center for Tutoring & Academic Support), the QCC Mathematics Learning Center, or the CUNY Tutor Corps.
- Complete an internship or apprenticeship.
- Build and create physical objects, i.e., artwork, engineering projects, theatre sets.
- Join the Society of Additive Manufacturing 3D Printing Club, the Stock Market Club or the Women in Science Club.
- Apply to be a fellow with the **Kupferberg Holocaust Center**.

Equity & Inclusion

- Demonstrate flexibility and keep an open mind to diverse ideas and environments, and new ways of thinking.
- Solicit and use feedback from multiple cultural perspectives to make inclusive and equity-minded decisions.
- Study and try to master a language other than your native tongue (join the QCC Foreign Language Society).
- Read and learn as much as you can about cultures and customs different from your own (Watch CUNY TV).
- Visit museums and cultural institutions (the Kupferberg Holocaust Center and QCC Art Gallery), that highlight works with a global perspective.
- Work or intern at an international company or organization whose core mission involves international issues and concerns.
- Sample and cook foods from around the world (Watch Native Dish on NYC Media)
- Physically travel if and when possible, or watch travel shows and see the world watch Bare Feet on NYC Media.



Leadership

- Be the team leader on a class presentation.
- Apply to become a member of a campus leadership organization or program e.g., QCC Emerging Leaders, QCC CUNY Black Male Initiative, NYC Men Teach, and Global Leaders Program.
- Hold elected office in Student Government or other QCC Student Clubs, Groups and Organizations.
- Be a captain of an athletic team.
- Organize events.
- Be a team leader or assistant manager at your job.
- Experience being a teacher's assistant as part of your education classes, or a camp counselor during the summer.
- Become an entrepreneur and start your own business (Participate in the CUNY New Venture Accelerator).

• Become a local community leader and engage in civic projects.



Professionalism

- Show up to class on time and hand in all your course assignments when they are due.
- Do well and earn a high GPA (3.3 and above).
- Earn academic awards and honors, such as the Dean's List, Phi Theta Kappa, the John F. Kennedy or the

Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Awards.

- Be punctual at work; be recognized at your job as an outstanding employee; be respectful of others; work efficiently and complete all your work-related projects in a timely manner.
- Join a professional association related to your future career.
- Make a personal commitment to be a positive and encouraging member of the QCC community and all the communities to which you belong.
- Apply to become a QCC Student Ambassador, Tiger Adviser or a Student/Tech Peer Mentor.



Teamwork

- Be an active member of your academic classes by participating in group presentations and projects.
- Seek out opportunities to work on team projects at your job.
- Participate in campus clubs and organizations (join the

QCC Chapter of NYPIRG - New York Public Interest Research Group).

- Become a member of a QCC athletic team (Tigers).
- Offer assistance to your peers and colleagues on the job when you see that they may need help with an assignment or are struggling to complete a project.
