



CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT (CNA): NYSED CERTIFICATION

[scholarship eligible]

This class is Hybrid: Queensborough Main Campus and Online

This program provides an excellent opportunity for students to join the healthcare system as Certified Nursing Assistants, an ideal profession for those seeking flexible hours working in nursing homes, hospitals, medical offices, and other healthcare facilities. The program covers anatomy and physiology, fundamentals of patient care, and clinical experience in residential healthcare facility.



THE AVERAGE CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT Salary in New York, NY IS \$41,438 As of november 2022, And the Range typically falls Between \$37,766 and \$45,755.

The US DOL Bureau of Labor Statistics reports a 5% (as fast as average) rate of job growth for CNA's between 2021 and 2031.

Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED/HSE and US Citizenship or Legal Working Permits. This is a 120-hour course that includes 78 online hours, 12 clinical on-site hours, plus a 30-hour externship at a nursing home.

EMT CERTIFICATION

[scholarship eligible] This is an on-campus, in-person

course.

Co-requisite: CPR (AHX 100) This course covers all techniques and operational aspects of an EMT. Demonstration, practice, and clinical observation are integrated with free online FEMA classes. Certifications provided by NYS Bureau of EMS. EMERGENCY ROOM TECHNICIAN

[scholarship eligible]

An ER Tech provides technical support to MDs and RNs to optimize patient care by providing Phlebotomy and IV stats; performing 12-lead EKGs; transporting patients to other departments; tending to wound care; obtaining lab specimens; documenting all care/procedures provided, and performing other responsibilities as assigned.

Requirements: Co-requisite is CPR (Basic Cardiac Life Support sanctioned by the AHA) and HS diploma or equivalent.

EKG TECHNICIAN

[scholarship eligible] This class is Hybrid: Queensborough Main Campus and Online

Co-requisite for this certification: AHX-100 CPR & AHX183- Standard First Aid Prerequisite: AHX179 Medical Terminology for Allied Health or valid AHA certifications in these courses.

Introduction to cardiac anatomy and terminology, recognition of cardiac emergencies, obtaining 12-lead ECG or EKG tracing and basic rhythm interpretation. For more information, call 718-631-6343



THE AVERAGE EKG TECHNICIAN Salary in New York, Ny is \$44,200 as of November 2022, but the Range typically Falls between \$39,200 and \$51,200.

PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN

[scholarship eligible] **This class is Hybrid: Queensborough Main Campus and Online** Co-requisites: AHX-100 (CPR) and AHX183 (Standard First Aid) Prerequisite: AHX179 Medical Terminology for Allied Health or valid AHA certifications in these courses.



PHLEBOTOMIST Salary in New York, Ny IS \$45,952 AS OF November, 2022 and the range typically Falls Between \$49,597 and \$58,284.

The US DOL Bureau of Labor Statistics projects a 10% (faster than average) growth rate between 2021 and 2031.

Obtain the introductory skills to secure an

entry-level Phlebotomist position. Learn various methods of blood collection through venipuncture, capillary puncture and, existing intravascular devices. Emphasizes use of anticoagulants, the order of draw, and procedures for obtaining and processing specimens. Safety considerations for all healthcare professionals and patients discussed. Registrants should purchase a stethoscope, B/P cuff and non-latex gloves.

CERTIFIED BILLING AND CODING SPECIALIST

[scholarship eligible]

This six-course medical career pathway focuses on medical billing and coding, skills used by professionals who create detailed records and invoices for healthcare institutions and work in revenue cycle management.



THE AVERAGE CERTIFIED BILLING & CODING SPECIALIST SALARY IN NEW YORK, NY IS \$53,300 AS OF NOVEMBER 2022, BUT THE RANGE TYPICALLY FALLS BETWEEN \$49,597 AND \$58.284.

The US DOL Bureau of Labor Statistics classifies a Certified Billing and Coding Specialist as a Medical Assistant and projects a 16% (much faster than average) growth between 2021 and 2031.]

CERTIFIED CLINICAL MEDICAL ASSISTANT

[scholarship eligible]

Certified Clinical Medical Assistants are vital members of any healthcare team and perform a variety of tasks that include phlebotomy, EKGs, assisting medical staff with procedures, injections, and administering medication, and maintaining electronic health records of patients. Upon completion of this eight-course program, participants can sit for the NHA's Certified Clinical Medical Assistant certification exam.

CERTIFIED MEDICAL ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT

[scholarship eligible]

This is an online course.

Certified Medical Administrative Assistants play important roles in today's medical community and are in great demand. The CMAA program at QCC consists of four courses:

Medical Terminology & Body Systems (MBX126); Electronic Health Records (MBX-005); Medical Assisting Administrative Procedures (MBX127); and the optional (but highly recommended) course -- Computer Readiness (MBX003) .

PATIENT CARE TECHNICIAN

[scholarship eligible]

Patient Care Technicians are multi-disciplinary technical workers trained to provide basic nursing assistant care as well as other skilled functions. Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Clinics, Labs and doctors' Offices all employ Patient Care Technicians.

The disciplines included in the program at Queensborough Community College include six core competencies:



- CPR- Basic Cardiac Life Support (AHX100) \$155
- Standard First Aid (AHX183) \$155
- Medical Terminology & Body Systems (MBX 126) \$475 (Pre-requisite for EKG and Phlebotomy)
- EKG Technician (AHX170) \$1,215
- Phlebotomy Technician (AHX171) \$1,315
- Certified Nursing Assistant (NUX200) \$1,215

HEALTHCARE COURSES

BASIC CARDIAC LIFE SUPPORT (CPR)

This is an in-person, on-campus course, and students must be fully vaccinated. This Certification course provides all of the requirements for health care provider and professional rescuers, which includes adult, child, and infant CPR; rescue breathing; and use of AED (Automatic External Defibrillator). AHA requires a "pass" grade on skills, exam, and minimum of 84 score on written exam to qualify for certification. Dress comfortably.

This is an in-person, on-campus course, and students must be fully vaccinated. Attain employee training on external bleeding control, injuries, wound care, asthma and allergic reactions, weather-related shocks, burns, poisons, and sudden illness in the workplace. Learn to recognize everyday emergency situations, and take appropriate action until professional help arrives.

CPT CODING - CURRENT PROCEDURAL TERMINOLOGY

This is an online class.

This class builds on the coding and billing procedures learned in ICD-10 (International Classification of Diseases) Coding, focusing on teaching the student how to enhance reimbursement in today's healthcare environment. Using current CPT coding system resources, students will learn in-depth coding systems for medical procedures. Lab work will include working directly with complex medical records, taking steps to assure third-party approval for recommended treatments/ procedures, and responding to and appealing insurance claim denials.

This program prepares adults to take the exam for the High School Equivalency Diploma (GED). Our highly qualified instructors will focus on the major subjects of the exam encompassing Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Reading and Writing (Reading through Language Arts, RLA). 

Q GETTING HERE



LOCATION

Queensborough Community College is located in Bayside, between Springfield Blvd. and Cloverdale Blvd. (223rd street) on 56th Ave. The campus is easily accessible by car from all parts of Queens and Long Island. It is just a few blocks north of the Springfield Boulevard Exit 29 on the Long Island Expressway, and immediately south of the Northern Boulevard exit on the Cross Island Parkway.

BY SUBWAY AND/OR BUS

From Flushing: Take Main Street Flushing Line (No. 7) to Main Street, Flushing Station. Take Q27* bus to campus.

From Jamaica: Take F train to 169th Street and Hillside Ave. and then the Q30* bus via Horace Harding Blvd. to Springfield Blvd. Walk north to 56th Ave. and turn right to campus. You can also take the E, J, or Z trains to the Sutphin/ Archer station and take the Q30 bus from there.

From the Bronx: Take the Q44 bus to Flushing Main Street. Transfer to the Q27* bus and go directly onto the QCC campus.

From Nassau County: The N-20, 21 bus line from Nassau County stops at the corner of Northern Blvd. and 223rd Street (Cloverdale Blvd.). The bus makes stops in the towns of Glen Cove, Roslyn, Manhasset, and Great Neck.

* The Q27 and Q30 buses now stop on the campus from 7 am to 11 pm on weekdays. Limited-Stop buses stop at Springfield Blvd. and 56th Ave.


