Admissions Committee, 2006-2007

- During committee meetings, members faced the challenge of deciding if a student should be readmitted to Queensborough after being academically dismissed. Many times, the academic record of applicants was such that it was not easy to discern if students could attain a GPA suitable for graduation. Even with the best intention, numerous credits of failing grades, or grades equivalent to failing, reduce the possibility that students can graduate with a GPA of 2.0.

With the help of Ms. Veronica Lukas, the Admissions Committee initiated the process of acquiring new computer software to aid in this process. It is hoped that this process can come to completion in the upcoming year. Such a tool would be very helpful for the committee.

- The committee also submitted a proposal to the Academic Senate concerning students who are readmitted to the college after an extended period of time. The “Fresh Slate” proposal would allow students returning to the college, after a lapse of 10 years, to enter with a ‘clean’ academic transcript. All past grades, whether passing or failing, would be expunged.
- Committee members were reminded of the importance to students of withdrawing properly from courses if unexpected circumstances arise. Numerous WI grades hamper the possibility of achieving a suitable GPA for graduation. This is certainly important information for incoming students.
- The committee welcomed Professors T. Bayer, S. Lall-Ramnarine, and H. Yao to serve during the 2007-2008 academic year.
- The committee also elected a new chairperson, Professor B. Mader, to serve during the 2007-2008 academic year.
- At the end of the 2006-2007 academic year, the following members left the committee for other assignments: Professors J. Jankowski, J. Molloy, and C. Spencer.
- The chairperson would like to thank the members of the committee for their service over the past year along with Mr. W. Yarde, Director of Admissions and Ms. J. Guzman, Office of Admissions throughout the 2006-2007 academic year. As always, the assistance of Mr. Yarde and Ms. Guzman allowed the committee to run smoothly.
- The chairperson was honored to serve. He leaves the committee in the very capable hands of the new chair, Prof. Mader and wishes him the best.
