## Report of the President to the Academic Senate March 9, 2010

## **Freshman Academies**

As we enter the second semester of the implementation of this important initiative, we must be ever vigilant to ensure that our students have all the assistance necessary for them to succeed. If we are to achieve our goal of doubling our three year graduation rate for first-time, full-time students from 11.8% to 23.6%, we must be able to analyze what we have done to date and to calibrate our initiative so as to impact the spring to fall retention rate. To this end, we:

- 1) Provided a roster for every faculty member indicating which students in their classes are also part of a Freshman Academy.
- 2) Contacted every student who did not register for the spring semester to encourage them to do so and/or determine their reasons for non-attendance.
- 3) Have planned an event on June 8th, for the 115 students who have completed 30 credits this year, to celebrate their accomplishment.
- 4) Will analyze the Praxis final report and share the action plan with the entire community.
- 5) Are reviewing the High Impact activities to see how we can improve upon them.
- 6) Will ask the faculty to help us recruit students who could benefit from summer courses. The greatest attrition rate takes place between the second and third semester.

## **Enrollment**

CUNY continues to monitor QCC's enrollment growth and has requested that the college limit its FTE to 10.808 for the Fall 2010 semester.

#### **Fundraising:**

As of January 31, we have raised \$2,357,391 toward our annual fundraising goal of \$2,892,839, inclusive of cash, pledges and in-kind gifts. We need to raise \$535,435 by June 30 to meet our goal.

In terms of the Annual Fund Appeal (cash + pledges only), our goal is to raise \$1M by the Partners Gala on April 29<sup>th</sup>, and we are already nearly halfway there. We have formed a President's Circle of Partners, and many of these individuals are now leading fundraising teams for our Gala. This year, the Partners Gala will be the Queens

community celebration of our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and Chancellor Matthew Goldstein has agreed to partner with Queensborough to make this a successful event. The Gala will be somewhat different this year as there will be no Honorees – instead, we will be honoring every attendee in the room – all our loyal supports of business and community leaders, legislative friends, faculty, staff and students. We have also "gone green" this year with an online journal and our new website allows individuals and organizations to purchase sponsorships, tickets, tables and ads online.

## 50th Anniversary:

Each of the six Freshman Academies have designed and scheduled events in celebration of the 50<sup>th</sup>. The Visual and Performing Arts Academy had their event last semester and the others are all scheduled for the spring. The next page lists the events with dates and details for each.

We have our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary faculty/staff BBQ scheduled for May 4<sup>th</sup> – rain or shine! And, our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Partners Gala, which will be a celebration with the greater Queens community, is scheduled for April 29<sup>th</sup> at Terrace on the Park.

We are still scheduling "Meet the Authors," book signing events with Dr. Peter Bales and Dr. Megan Elias, our authors of Queensborough at 50: Celebrate the Memories! Anyone who contributes a minimum of \$50 to our student scholarship will receive a complimentary copy.
