

### President's Report to the Academic Senate

### March 13, 2018

#### ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT UPDATE

- The first two phases of freshmen students have been received by the Office of Admissions. With these two phases, nearly 7500 freshmen will receive notification of acceptance, which is an increase of 1600 students from Fall 2017. The College also received the transfer phase file, which included 100 admitted transfers. The Office of New Student Engagement hosted the first New Student and Family Welcome Session for the Fall 2018 enrollment cycle on Tuesday, February 27<sup>th</sup>. During the session, newly admitted students and their families learned more about the College, including the Academies and special programs such as ASAP, College Discovery, and CUNYStart. They also met with staff from Admissions, Financial Aid, and Testing to assist them with steps in the enrollment process.
- Academic advisement within the Queensborough Academies began on Monday, February 26<sup>th</sup>. Hobson Retain communications have been begun and is ongoing to all Academy students.

### **RESOURCE ALLOCATION PLANNING FOR FISCAL YEAR 19**

The University cut the QCC's Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 funding by \$1.15 million this ٠ January, citing reduced State base aid associated with community college enrollment declines. This cut has been baselined in the College's FY 2019 budget, forcing the College to work with less resources going forward. As a result, the College will be asking departments to reexamine their regular recurring budgets, consistent with the reduced enrollment, as part of QCC's annual Resource Planning & Allocation Process for FY 2019. By early March, all divisions and departments will have been provided with historic information and templates to assist in preparing budget requests for the coming academic year. In keeping with our practices, this process is designed to ensure our resources support our highest priorities, as reflected in the Strategic Plan developed by the College Advisory Planning Committee. Through the respective Vice President, each Division will submit budget request proposals for funding related to strategic priorities and operational needs. These proposals will be reviewed and prioritized by the Cabinet. The Budget Subcommittee of the Faculty P&B Committee and the QCC Academic Senate Committee on Budget Advisement will be consulted prior to our final expenditure plan for FY 19.

### Middle States

• The self-study process continues. Led by the three executive co-chairs—Dr. Antonella Ansani, Dean Arthur Corradetti, and Prof. Kelly Ford—seven working groups are each developing a chapter of the self-study report, each chapter devoted to one of the seven Middle States standards. Chapters of the self-study report will be completed by June. A draft of the full self-study report will be distributed to the campus for comment and suggestions in Fall 2018; the full self-study report is due to Middle States in February 2019. An evaluation team chair, Dr. Joann La Perla-Morales, president at Middlesex Community College, has been selected for the college's site visit. Dr. La Perla-Morales will make a preliminary site visit in the fall, on a date yet to be determined, will provide comment and suggestions for the draft self-study report, and will then return with the full evaluation team in March 2019. At that time, the evaluation team will be on campus for two and a half days, providing a preliminary site visit report before they leave campus. The Middle States Commission will make a final decision on the college's reaccreditation in June 2019.

### Academic Momentum Plan

- **STEM Waiver** As previously reported, \$167,000 of the STEM Tuition Waiver Program funds were used during the winter 2018 session. 98% of the students completed their courses: 48.5% received a grade of A, and 88.6% achieved a grade of C or better. The balance of the funding will be available for Summer Session 1. We are still waiting for a decision from the Mayor's office as to additional funding for the academic year 2019, which includes Summer Session 2.
- Milestone Scholarship Of the 30 Milestone scholarships awarded in the winter 2018 session more than 50% of the students received an A or A- and 90% received a grade of B- or better, with no student getting an F. We will continue the Milestone Scholarship for the summer 2018 sessions to help students reach their "30-credit milestone."

### **STUDENT RESOURCES**

- Emergency funding is available to students who face a financial crisis that puts at risk their continued enrollment toward a degree.
