## 149 IX. New Business

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151 1. Dean Corradetti provided an update on Middle States Self Study Process. An explanation was given regarding having some suggestions changed into 152 153 recommendations. A copy of several suggestions (with three highlighted to consider 154 into recommendations) from the middle states report was circulated to obtain input 155 from the Senate. The three suggestions are: 156

- To ensure periodic and systematic assessment of ethics and integrity at • the institution, establish a representative body charged with the periodic assessment of ethics and integrity as such principles and matters relate to the operation of the institution at every level in the service of mission and goals.
- 161 Provide more systematic professional development to support 162 administrative staff to assess for support services outcomes aligned with 163 department mission and goals. 164
  - Conduct periodic assessment of governance structures and processes

166 Senator Pecorino made a motion to adopt the 3 suggestions as recommendations. 167 Senator Jacobowitz requested to add another suggestion (i.e., reinstating the faculty 168 dialogue) as a recommendation. After some discussion from other senators and the 169 President, it was decided to amend the initial motion of moving three suggestions to 170 recommendations to four suggestions.

- A motion was made, amended, seconded, and not adopted 11-43-2 to 171 consider four suggestions to be changed to recommendations on the middle 172 173 states self-study report.
