- 1. Addition to Sept. 20, 2006 minutes IT Director Sherman informed the committee of a new e-mail server that will allow similar utilities off campus as is presently available on-campus.
- 2. Minutes from the Sept. 20 meeting were unanimously approved.
- 3. Chair Thorsen presented information regarding a new faculty website server that allows off-campus postings to the website. Some details of the server, obtained from ACC Director Naples, include:
 - a. connection to the server will be through a secure FTP.
 - b. strong passwords will be used
 - c. the server will be backed up periodically but the onus for maintaining data is on the faculty
 - d. faculty can use standard HTML or ASP. FrontPage Extensions cannot be used.
 - e. Connection clients include: WINSCP (free download), Dreamweaver and Web-Drive. Recommends Dreamweaver.
 - f. Faculty must provide their own software.
