### Discussion:

The students have been claiming to have their professor's approval in withdrawing from their course(s) after the withdrawal period has ended. However, in the absence of any formal letter/recommendation from professors, it is difficult to determine if the professor is actually supporting the withdrawal. The Committee, therefore, recommended sending an e-mail to all faculty members to write a formal letter on the letter-head, in case they chose to support the students' withdrawal.

A recommendation from the professors would definitely help in the decision-making. However, other aspect would be considered to reach a final approval.

The future dismissal procedures were also discussed. Keeping in view the number of enrolment for the spring 2012 semester, there would be stricter policy for retaining students for the Spring 2012 semester. Students with a GPA of more than 1.8 would get a preference to continue.
