INTRODUCTION






The Transfer Resource Center (TRC) provides support and resources to students who are transferring from QCC to another higher education institution.




Challenges for Transfer

- Not seeking professional academic advisement
- Changing majors/loss of credits
- Lack of research and planning
- Unaware of transfer timeline
- Late application submission
- Finances



Faculty and Advisor Transfer Timeline



Obstacles to Completion

- Transportation
- Misinformation
- Family pressure
- Peer pressure
- Time constraints
- Declining online offerings
- Lack of a graduation plan
- Class cancellations
- Finances





Minimizing Obstacles

Faculty and staff awareness of:

- Transfer timeline
- Importance of advisement
- Opportunities available to students
- Support services and resources









Allows you to check:

- How courses transfer across CUNY
- Credits for prior learning (Non-CUNY, trainings, and exams)
- For course equivalencies (e-permit)

Current students can login for a personalized experience and can create transfer plans.




ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS



Articulation Agreements











- Agreement between a 2-year and a 4-year college.
- Connects associate's program to bachelor's degree programs.
- Ensures smooth transition to transfer school.

☐ Specifies:

- Course by course transfer equivalencies.
- What needs to be taken after transfer to complete the bachelor's degree
- Admissions standards and requirements
- Availability of transfer scholarships.

















Total: 86







- Reduces loss of credit during transfer.
- Allows students to plan ahead as they take courses at 2-year institution.
- Transfer equivalencies often apply to all students.
- Additional financial assistance.
- Easier admission and transfer process.
- Dual admission in some cases.
- Faculty to faculty relationships.







- ☐ Some evolve from existing relationships between faculty at two schools:
 - Dean and Provost become involved as agreement is formalized.
 - Contact Dean Pullin for help with the written agreement.

- Administration to administration:
 - Chair requests help from Dean Pullin establishing agreement with specific program at a specific school.
 - Dean Pullin reaches out to Dean and/or Chair to start negotiation.
 - Faculty from both schools work out transfer equivalencies.







- 4-year institution reaches out to us:
 - Often looking for increase enrollment and more diverse student body.
 - May start with Transfer Coordinators in their admissions office.
 - Dean Pullin contacts Chair and faculty in appropriate department.
 - Final decision to negotiate rests with the department.
- ☐ We don't usually negotiate with private, for-profit institutions
- ☐ We prioritize 4-year institutions favored by our graduates

- Students will receive support while at NYU until degree completion













Pre-Advising Survey Results
