# TRANSFER AGREEMENT QUEENSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S LA 1 PROGRAM to THE NYU STEINHARDT SCHOOL OF EDUCATION'S B.S. TEACHING SOCIAL STUDIES GRADES 7-12

#### NEW YORK UNIVERSITY PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

NYU's B.S. Teaching Social Studies Grades 7-12 program requires 129 credits--44 credits of general education courses, 40 credits in Content Core, and 45 credits of pedagogy courses. (See attached Program of Study Form.) While Queensborough students must complete 52 credits of general education courses, they will be held for one science course rather than the two indicated on the Program of Study Form.

TRANSFERRING CREDITS FROM QUEENSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE Students completing the LA 1 Program at Queensborough Community College may transfer 58 of their required 60 credits toward a B.S. in Teaching Social Studies Grades 7-12. Please note that courses transferring to The Steinhardt School of Education must have a grade of "C" or better.

The following 58 credits of Queensborough courses transfer to meet all 44 credits of the required General Education requirements, 8 credits of Content Core requirements, and 6 credits of the Pedagogical Core (Human Development I and one semester of Human Development II):

Any one of the following courses:

Art (AR-310, 311, 312, 313, 315, 316, 317, 318) or Dance (PE-711) or Music (MU-110, 120, 140, 141, 152, 154, 156, 157, 158, 159, 160, 170, 180) or Speech Communication (SP-471, 472)

EN-101 English Composition I, EN-102 English Composition II and any one course from the EN-200, 300, or 400 series

Foreign Language (two semesters)

Mathematics (MA-120, 301, 303, 315, 336, 338, 340, 440, 441, or 442)

Laboratory Science

Elective in Math, Science, Computer Literacy, or Computer Science

HE-102 Critical Issues in Health

History (HI-110, 111, or 112 and one additional course in the HI-100 Series)

Social Science Electives (Students should take SS-510 and SS-515)

Speech Communications (SP-211)

Liberal Arts and Free Electives: In order to transfer 58 credits, QCC students must use their free electives to take liberal arts courses. Students should take the following electives: SS110, 120, or 130; SS-211 or 212; and HI-127.
